Key Events and Programs



Trail Skills Institute: 5 volunteers attended the first official group activity hosted by the Volunteer Program on June 20-21 since the COVID-19 shutdown. While participation was light due to the increase in the severity of the outbreak in Arizona, we were able to keep our volunteers safe and still give solid trail skills instruction thanks to the care and dedication of our trainer, Matt Roberts of Flagline Trails. The training and trail work was held near Mormon Lake.

Trail Skills Institute Video Series: On June 11, Arizona State Parks and Trails announced the ATA Volunteer Program was awarded their second consecutive Safety and Environmental Education Grant to develop 5 videos of a 10 video series teaching volunteer trail skills. The video series is intended to supplement in-person training rather than to replace it. The video series will help first time and novice volunteers improve their skills, and its universal accessibility and availability will help move forward our goal of increasing the diversity of our volunteer corps. The videos are being produced by Outdoor Evolution's Darwin Rakestraw, content is being developed by Matt Roberts of Flagline Trails and Mark Loseth of American Conservation Experience. Mr. Loseth is the instructor onscreen with Wendy as backup and doing the voiceover work. The target is 10 videos of no more than 6 minutes in length to maximize attention span and engagement. Using a variety of filming techniques and modern social media cues, we hope to establish a film series which will be fun to watch as well as informative. Filming began in early June.

ATA COVID-19 Epidemic Protocols

Mirroring work done by other National Scenic Trails, Conservation Corps and volunteer focused organization, the ATA has developed our own field safety protocols for volunteer operations. The result is an exhaustive document detailing plans for keeping staff and volunteers safe while conducting field operations for the ATA. A shorter summary was designed to be shared directly with volunteers and covered during tailgate safety briefings.
